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
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
Team responded a **Trauma Incident** at Brgy. Imelda Bliss Village, City of Ilagan, Isabela last **April 26, 2025**. The patient was conscious he suffered laceration on the forehead approximately 1 inch. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to GFNDY Sr. Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.



Team responded a **Trauma Incident** at Brgy. Guibang, Gamu Isabela last **April 27, 2025**. The patient suffered laceration wound at right cheek, multiple abrasion upper and lower extremities. Driving under influence of liquor as verbalized by the patient. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to GFNDY Sr. Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.

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


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
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
