The patient had also cold and sore throat for two (2) weeks as stated by the significant others. The Emergency Care Assistant conducted continuous Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the patient was immediately endorsed to GFNDySr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Medical Incident at Osmeña, City of Ilagan, Isabela last February 5, 2021. Upon interventions, the patient brought to Isabela Doctors General Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident last February 1, 2021 at San Felipe, City of Ilagan, Isabela. The patient was conscious and coherent and suffered a possible fracture on the left hand. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to Isabela GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.








