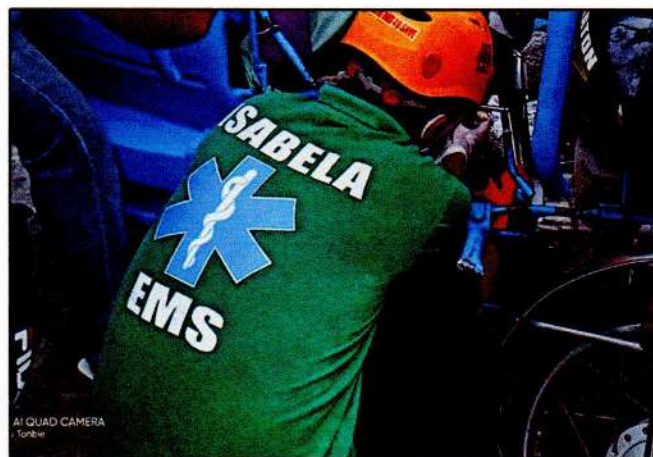


**Medical Incident happened in Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela responded by the team last July 6, 2020. As verbalized, the patient was suffering from nausea and dizziness. Upon giving interventions the patient refused to be brought to the hospital.**





**Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at Mansibang, Naguillan, Isabela involving a single motorcycle (Self-Accident) last July 5, 2020. The patient was unconscious and under the influence of alcohol. After the Aiders interventions the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.**



**Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela involving a Tricycle (Self-Accident) last July 13, 2020. The patient suffered a punctured at the right leg and numbness at he the affected part. After immediate interventions the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.**



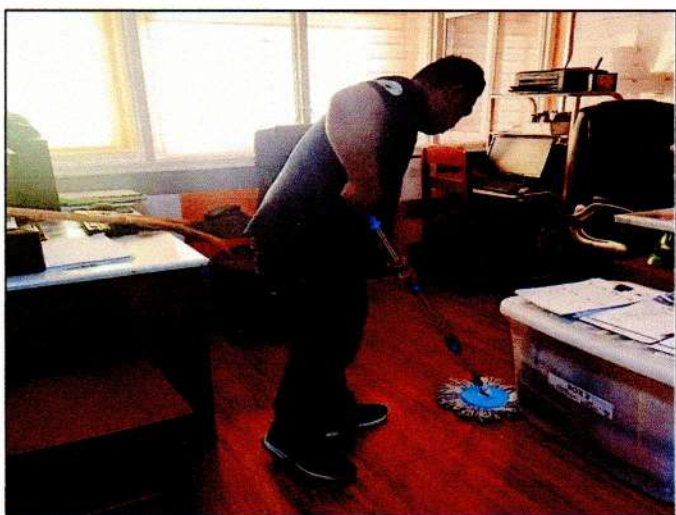

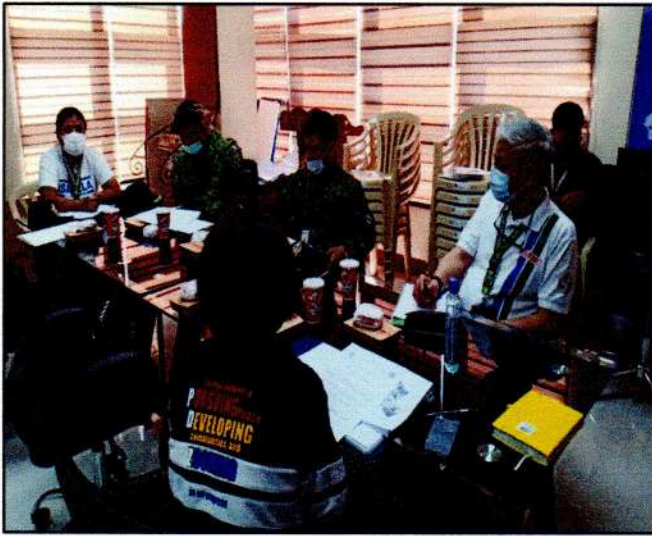
