The Province of Isabela being under TCWS No. 1 will soon experience strong breeze to near gale conditions over the Coastal Towns and the province as a whole forecasted to experienced light to moderate rains that could possibly cause flooding. In this regard the office conducted Text Blasting to inform the constituents of the province to prepare for the incoming typhoon and possible pre-evacuation.</p>

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Team responded to a Medical Incident happened at Baculud, City of Ilagan, Isabela last October 6, 2020. Upon the aider's assessments, it was found out that the patient was weak in appearance, has history of Diabetes Mellitus and Stroke. Upon interventions, the patient was brought to Isabela United Doctors Medical Hospital (IUDMC).



Medical Incident happened at Provincial Treasury Office, Capitol, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela responded by the DART 831 last October 28, 2020. After assessment it was found out that the patient was suffering from dizziness, spasm and pain at the left hip, left thigh and popliteal area. After the patient's needs were attended, the patient was brought to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela involving a Single Motor and SUV last October 2, 2020. Patient was suffered contusion at the forehead, abrasion on both knee and arm and laceration at the left side of the head, the patient happened to be driving under the influence of alcohol. After immediate interventions the patients was brought to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at District III, Gamu, Isabela involving a Single Motor and Sedan last October 28, 2020. The patient suffered an abrasion on the left knee, right hand and dizziness. After the Aiders interventions the patient was brought to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.



Team provided an Inter-facility Transfer to a patient recently discharge from a hospital. The patient was transferred from Taguig City, Metro Manila to Gamu, Isabela, conducted last October 17, 2020.



Team provided an Inter-facility Transfer to a patient diagnosed with seizure secondary to Brady Arrhythmia. The patient was transferred from Isabela United Doctors Medical Hospital (IUDMC), Isabela to Philippine Heart Center, Quezon City, conducted last October 25, 2020.
