


I. PREVENTION AND MITIGATION	Avoided hazards and mitigated their potential impacts by reducing vulnerabilities and exposure and enhancing capacities of communities	1. Mainstreamed and integrated Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) in local development, policies, plans and budgets; 2. DRRM/CCA sensitive environmental management; 3. Increased disaster resiliency of infrastructure systems; 4. Community based and scientific DRR/CCA; and 5. Risk transfer mechanisms.	1. Daily monitoring of water level and inflow/outflow of Magat Dam and continuous monitoring of coastal towns and of overflow bridges on the province; 2. Safety measures were strictly observed in conducting Emergency Response, Inter-facility Transfer and Mobility Assistance. Assessing and knowing the condition and history of a patient was also emphasized particularly in catering Medical Transfers and Mobility Assistance; and 3. The Office is continuously conducting daily disinfection and thorough cleaning of work places, most especially ambulances and other office vehicles as well as the rescuers themselves after an emergency response to prevent the spread of the virus. In compliance with the Memorandum No. 77, the office is conducting daily disinfection to all offices within the Capitol building and compound as preventive measure against COVID-19 and other communicable diseases.

Capacitating the community with the necessary skills, knowledge and enhancing their capability by conducting Community Based Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Trainings and other disaster related trainings that will

PDRRMO/DART 831 Provided Medical Team and rescue ambulance in convoy and provided emergency assistance (Standby Medic), implemented health safety protocols during the Inday Sara Duterte “Caravan” at the Queen Isabela Park, Provincial Capitol Compound, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela last February 15, 2022; and 3. Continuous dissemination of information regarding on weather updates and gale warning advisories thru radio message for transmission and the social media and continuous coordination with Regional Task Force on COVID-19 and other concerned agencies as well as continuous acquiring and dissemination of information regarding COVID-19 updates, resolutions and guidelines.

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The Office continuously conduct *daily disinfection and thorough cleaning* of work places, most especially ambulances and other office vehicles as well as the rescuers themselves after an emergency response to prevent the spread of the virus.



In compliance with Memorandum No. 77 of the Provincial Governor, PDRMO personnel are religiously conducting *daily disinfection to all offices within the Capitol building and compound* as preventive measures against COVID-19.



Team responded a **Trauma Incident** involving single motor (inflicted-incident) at Sitio Pag-asa, Namnama, City of Ilagan, Isabela last **February 17, 2022**. The patient suffered multiple abrasion at face, both hands and both feet. **Driving under the influence of alcohol** as verbalized by the victim. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions the patient was immediately brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.



Team responded a **Trauma Incident** involving single motor (self-accident) at Linglingay, Gamu, Isabela last **February 20, 2022**. The patient suffered abrasion at left cheek and both knees, contusion at left part of the forehead and possible fracture at right arm. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions the patient was immediately brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.



Team responded to a **Medical Incident** (walk-in) at PDRRMO – BFP Headquarters, Provincial Capitol Compound, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela last **February 03, 2022**. The patient (toddler) seizure twice (2x) difficulty of breathing, weak, pale looking and fever since morning (February 03, 2022) as verbalized by the relatives. After immediate intervention by Emergency Care Assistants the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital for further medical treatment.




Team responded to a **Medical Incident** at Villa Margarita, San Felipe, City of Ilagan, Isabela last **February 24, 2022**. The patient experienced and elevated blood pressure. Accordingly, he is complaining chest pain. After immediate intervention by Emergency Care Assistants the patient was brought to Isabela Doctors General Hospital for further medical treatment.



Provided **Medical Evacuation (MEDEVAC)** for a patient conscious and coherent, body weak and diagnosed enlargement of heart. The patient was transferred from Mabini St., District 1, Cauayan City, Isabela to Sunset Village, Subdivision, Angeles City, Pampanga last **February 02, 2022**.



Provided **Medical Evacuation (MEDEVAC)** for a patient diagnosed kidney failure, inability to move freely secondary by his condition. The patient was transferred from Cauayan Medical Specialist to San Miguel Subdivision, Barangay Bahay Toro, Quezon City last **February 18, 2022**.





