88 **II. CALL TO ORDER**

89
90 Council Co-Action Officer Atty. Constante A. Foronda Jr. acted as chairman of the
91 meeting and called the same to order at 10:03 o'clock in the morning.

93 **III. ROLL CALL AND CERTIFICATION ON THE EXISTENCE OF A QUORUM**

94
95 Ms. Melody Eve T. Ballesteros, who was requested to act as Council Secretary,
96 called the roll. With 37 or majority of the 64 Council members under Executive Order No.
97 29-A Series of 2022, the acting Council Secretary certified the existence of a quorum for
98 the valid transaction of business.

100 **IV. ORDER OF BUSINESS**

101
102 **1. Reading and Adoption of the Previous Minutes**
103

104 All members were furnished with copies of the minutes of the proceedings during
105 the 3rd Quarter Regular Meeting of the Council for 2023 weeks prior, thus it was moved
106 that its reading be dispensed with. A motion to adopt said minutes ensued. It was
107 seconded. With no objections to the motion, the minutes of the proceedings during the
108 3rd Quarter Regular Meeting of the Council for 2023 were adopted.
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110
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2. Weather Update

PAGASA-DOST Chief Meteorologist and Council member Ramil Tuppil reported on the weather outlook for the period covering December 2023 to May 2024. He discussed the effects of the Northeast Monsoon on Northern Luzon as of December 14, 2023. He mentioned that a Low Pressure Area (LPA) last located outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility 1,865 kms. east of Southeastern Mindanao is being monitored by his Office.

Mr. Tuppil then reminded the Council about the prevailing El Niño status. He explained that a strong El Niño is present in the tropical Pacific and it is showing signs of further intensification in the coming months as sea surface temperature anomalies reach more than 1.5°C.

As regards the forecasted rainfall condition in the Cagayan Valley Region, Mr. Tuppil said that the Cagayan Valley will likely experience below normal to way below normal rainfall conditions during the forecast period, except in Batanes where near normal conditions are expected in December, March, and May. Additionally, Cagayan is forecast to have near normal conditions in May. The temperature expected throughout the country during the forecast period will be below average to warmer than average surface air temperatures. Cold temperature surges are expected to occur during the Northeast Monsoon season.

Two to five tropical cyclones are expected to enter or develop in the Philippine Area of Responsibility during the period from December 2023 to May 2024. Lastly, Mr. Tuppil talked about the Meteorological Dry Spell or Drought Outlook. He stated that a possible drought may be expected from February 2024 to May 2024.

After the weather presentation, the Chair asked the resource speaker which year was it when Isabela had the worst El Niño. Mr. Tuppil answered that the years 1997, 1998, 2009, and 2010 were the worst in Isabela. However, he cannot make an estimate on how severe the effects of the impending El Niño will be compared to said years.

3. Magat Dam Update

Mr. Richard A. Dagdag, the representative of the Department Manager of NIA-MARIIS, updated the Council on the status of the Magat Dam. He reported that as of midnight of December 13, 2023, the reservoir water elevation was at 185.58 meters above sea level, with an average inflow of 96.14 cubic meters per second, and with an average outflow of 169.86 cubic meters per second with no spillway gates open.

Mr. Dagdag assured the Council that, despite the prevailing El Niño conditions, the reservoir has enough water for both irrigation and power generation purposes by controlling its outflow. Mr. Eliseo Rey M. Ingles, the representative of the President of SN Aboitiz Power Magat, Inc., assured the Council that should El Niño cause a shortage in the power generated by the Magat Dam, Isabela can rely on non-hydroelectric power producers to augment the power supply.

4. Piper Plane Crash Post-Operations Report

Atty. Constante A. Foronda Jr., in his capacity as the Provincial DRRM Officer, reported to the Council on the search and rescue (SAR) operations for the RPC-1234 Piper 32-300 Cherokee Six which crashed in a portion of the Sierra Madre within San Mariano, Isabela.

Atty. Foronda recounted that the Piper piloted by Capt. Levy Abul took off from Cauayan Airport at 9:35AM on November 30, 2023 on a cargo flight to Palanan Airport. As there was space for one passenger, Erma Escalante boarded the flight. The Piper was reported as missing when it failed to land in Palanan when it was expected to no later than 10:30AM. The Tactical Operations Group 2 (TOG2) of the Philippine Air Force reported said incident to the Office of the Civil Defense (OCD) Regional Office No. 02. Afterwards, OCD sought the assistance of Atty. Foronda and other heads of agencies with SAR capabilities and arranged an emergency virtual meeting in the afternoon of the same day, and an Incident Management Team (IMT) was formed. It was agreed that the IMT will meet face-to-face the following day at the headquarters of the TOG2 at Cauayan Airport which was chosen as the command center.

The IMT was activated, and Atty. Foronda was chosen to be the Incident Commander. With the aid of flightradar24, a phone application used by Atty. Foronda to track flights, the Piper appeared to have stopped at a certain point in the mountains of the Sierra Madre. However, it appeared that when the Piper appeared to have stopped, it still had speed and climb rate and, therefore, it was still airborne. That meant that the point where the Piper appeared to have stopped is not the crash site. The Piper simply went outside flightradar24 coverage. At least such point will be the basis of the search area.

TOG2 caused a Sokol SAR helicopter to be sent in to help in the search and rescue. Meanwhile, 32 ground searchers of the PNP Mobile Force Company were deployed to reach the search area from the west, while 44 ground searchers from MDRRMO Palanan, Bureau of Fire Protection, PNP-Palanan, and indigenous people were deployed from the east. Due to the cloudy weather, the Sokol could not fly low enough for its crew to see the search area below. The weather improved on December 5, 2023 allowing a Robinson R44 helicopter to join the Sokol in the aerial search. Within 30 minutes from taking off, the R44 pilot found the wreckage among trees near the top of an almost-vertical mountain slope. The fuselage appeared intact, thus increasing the chances of survival. All the deployed searchers and rescuers were then instructed to proceed to the crash site.

Due to its location, the plane wreckage could not be immediately reached by helicopters. They could not even get close enough to determine the condition of the pilot and/or the passenger. The best that could be done on December 6, 2023 was to drop a team of 4 PDRRMO, 2 PAF, and 5 BFP rescuers by Sokol helicopter at a landing zone about

5 kms down the crash site and they will go on foot for the rest of the way. Due to the terrain, said rescuers only managed to cover 2 kms before sunset that day.

On December 7, 2023, the Sokol found a site near the wreckage where rescuers could rappel down to. It picked up 2 PDRRMO and 3 PAF rescuers and flew them to it. Said rescuers reached the wreckage and found the pilot who appeared to have died upon impact. A makeshift shelter, an improvised sleeping surface, and several snack food wrappers indicated that the passenger survived the crash. However, she was nowhere near the crash site when the rescuers got there. The logical assumption is that she walked down the slope to seek help. The body of the pilot and the rescue (converted to a retrieval) team were flown out of the crash site to the TOG2 headquarters. The remains of the pilot were turned over to the widow.

Since the missing passenger could have gone towards any direction in the thickly forested area, it would take weeks for human ground and aerial searchers to find her. Since time is of the essence, the fastest available way to find her was by a scent-tracking K9 team. The AK9 Mandog Society team was fetched from Sto. Tomas, Batangas. On December 9, 2023, a second set of rescuers consisting of 2 scent-tracking dogs and their 4 handlers, 6 BFP rescuers, and 1 PDRRMO radioman/rescuer were flown from the TOG2 headquarters to be dropped near the wreckage. The tracker dogs got stressed from the helicopter flight and could not immediately perform optimally. The trackers were constrained to wait for the next morning before starting to work. Within 2 hours of scent-tracking in the morning of December 10, 2023, "Wheel", a dog of the Beagle breed, led the rescuers to the passenger. Sadly, she was found lifeless. It appeared that the passenger fell off a 15-foot cliff and landed head-first on boulders at the bottom. The body of passenger Erma Escalante was flown to the TOG2 headquarters in the afternoon. At 5:00PM the IMT operations were terminated.

By December 11, 2023, the remains of Capt. Levy Abul had been cremated and flown to Quezon City, and those of Erma Escalante had been embalmed, put in a casket, flown to Palanan, and then driven to her relatives in southern Divilacan.

5. Approval of the 2024 LDRRM Fund Investment Plan

Atty. Constante A. Foronda Jr., in his capacity as the Provincial DRRM Officer, presented for proper Council action the ₱248,225,782.00 Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund Investment Plan (LDRRMFIP) for 2024. A mandatory 30% of it or ₱74,467,734.60 is the Quick Response Fund (QRF) and 70% of it or ₱173,758,047.40 shall be for Prevention and Mitigation, Preparedness, Response, Rehabilitation and Recovery (PMPRRR).

He proposed that the allocation thereof to be as follows:

I. 30% QRF ₱ 74,467,734.60

II. 70% PMPRRR

A. Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses ₱ 72,258,047.40

B. Capital Outlay

285 **5. Reprogramming of unused funds in the 2023 LDRRM Fund Investment Plan**

286
287 For efficient rescue operations, the PDRRM Office intends to pre-position Water
288 Search and Rescue equipment to flood-prone municipalities in the province. Ten (10)
289 units of 14-foot rescue boat with trailer and 20-horsepower outboard motor will be
290 needed in such an undertaking.

291
292 In the 2023 LDRRM Investment Plan is an item “2 units baraccuda rescue boat with
293 trailer” and the amount of ₱1,400,000.00 is allocated for such item. The title, however, is
294 not generic and does not specify the size and power of the rescue boat, thus it should be
295 defunded. Therefore, to implement the above-mentioned rescue strategy, Atty. Foronda
296 moved to re-program ₱7,500,000.00 from the unused portions of items in the 2023
297 LDRRMFIP to allow the purchase the required equipment. The motion was duly seconded.
298 When there were no objections, the Council passed this resolution:


