Savings Program and Affordable Housing Program for every Small Farmers

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

BRO PAG IBIG is the twelfth program of the Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) launched in January 2015.

BRO PAG IBIG is a climate change adaptation program of the PGI. It aims to help farmers lessen their vulnerability to the effects of climate change by helping them build sturdy houses through affordable housing program.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

BRO PAG IBIG program aims to enroll 10,000 small farmers of the Province of Isabela to be a member PAG-IBIG fund for them to enjoy the benefits of the program such as:

- a.) Savings
- b.) Tax free dividends
- c.) Death Benefit grants
- d.) Short-term or Multi-Purpose loans for:
 - Emergency
 - Tuition Fees
 - Medical Needs
 - · In case of calamity
- e.) Affordable housing loans with low interest rates and longer repayment periods.

ACCOMPLISHMENT

In the first year of operation of the program, a total of five thousand forty (5,040) farmers from different municipalities were already enrolled by the PGI. Now, we already have eight thousand five hundred four (8504) as of December 2018 wherein 3,478 of them are still enrolled in the program and 5,026 have already been paid 24 months of contribution.

IMPACT

An overwhelming response was received by the PGI from the constituents of Isabela for the BRO PAG IBIG Program. As a proof, almost nine thousand (9,000) small farmers were already enrolled.

With the continuous effort of the PGI to help farmers improve over-all living condition of the farmers, the BRO PAG IBIG program will help them save for the future and put-up their dream houses.



SUSTAINABILITY

The Provincial Government of Isabela through the Sangguniang Panlalawigan passed Resolution No. 154 series of 2014 to ensure the sustainability of the program, officially designating the Provincial Treasurer of her authorized representative as the person responsible to remit the allotted voluntary monthly contributions to the PAG IBIG Fund Branch. The PGI has allocated P5 million for BRO PAG IBIG thru Appropriation Ordinance no. 21, series of 2015. A Memorandum of Agreement was aslo entered into between the PAGIBIG and the Provincial Local Government Unit of Isabela (PLGU-Isabela.)


