Production/Propagation and Disposition of seedlings	Production, propagation and procurement of seedling stock and disposition of seedlings	Number of seedlings procured: A total of 10,000 assorted fruit-bearing seedlings were procured. These shall be provided to requesting constituents in line with the Reforestation Target Action (RTA) project; Number of seedlings released: A total of 1,499 assorted seedlings were disposed to various requesting constituents composed of 600 forest tree seedlings, 745 fruit-bearing tree seedlings, 12 coconut and 142 bamboo propagules; Mortality rate at 2.17% equivalent to 1,784 seedlings was incurred. Stock balance: 70,268 seedlings as of August 31, 2021				
b. Maintenance Works	Maintenance of Provincial Nursery; Operation of Clonal Nursery; Brushing, ring weeding and greening of two nurseries; arrangement, and sorting of seedlings for hardening; seed collection and propagation; and other activities that were assigned to be accomplished during the period	Conducted continuous nursery regular maintenance and operational activities such as seedling bed improvement, soil potting, seeds and wildlings collection, transplanting and sorting of seedlings. A small fruit orchard is also maintained for development.				
2. Climate Change Mitigation/ Adaptation and DRRM Initiatives	Implementation of forest rehabilitation and other greening efforts such as but not limited to watershed rehabilitation, agroforestry, riparian rehabilitation & development, mangrove & beach forests rehabilitation and urban greening with the aim to reduce the causes of global warming and its effect to biodiversity; and protect communities from risks of hazards caused by natural calamities.	Beach Forest Rehabilitation Project: Personnel of this Office conducted project inspection of the 6 hectares and 4 hectares beach forest rehabilitation projects at Sitio Sabang, Maligaya, Palanan and Bicobian, Divilacan, respectively. Results were as follows: 1. Sitio Sabang, Maligaya, Palanan - survival rate is estimated to be at 95% to 98%. This can be attributed to the favorable weather conditions in the area and the presence of regular personnel assigned in the plantation; 2. Sturdy seedlings area generally observed with the Botong seedlings; Talisai and Agoho seedlings showed resiliency despite sluggish growth which is common to the development characteristics of the said species; 3. Maintenance and protection activities are regularly conducted particularly replanting. Non removal of weeds is part of protection to help maintain moisture surrounding the planted seedlings.				

Also, the group was able to visit and evaluate the three (3) hectares plantation established for the years 2018 to 2019. The plantation is now evidently visible as the planted seedlings have improved in height and sturdiness. Maintenance and protection activities implemented by the LGU thru MENRO worked effectively with the favorable weather conditions. 2. Bicobian, Divilacan - In general, the team observed an estimated 80% survival rate of planted seedlings. This can be attributed to the favorable condition in the locality. However, no permanent LGU personnel assigned due to the location and distance of the project area from the mainland Divilacan; the seedlings show sturdiness; nevertheless immediate replanting was recommended for the 20% mortality. Staking was suggested to easily identify the planted seedlings from the creeping weeds and other vegetation.

Riparian Rehabilitation Project:

Tumauini - implemented riparian rehabilitation project in partnership with Municipal LGU-MENRO and CSWD for the cash-work program; A total of 3,000 bamboo propagules were planted on August 10-13, 2021 along the 3-kilometer stretch of Cagayan River and its tributaries within Barangays Sta. Catalina, Fugu Abajo, Tunggui and Carpintero, Tumauini;

Sto. Tomas - implemented riparian rehabitation thru planting a total of 1,000 bamboo propagules and 200 Kupang seedlings on August 6, 2021 supporting the slope protection along Bagabag Creek;

Reina Mercedes - implemented the project together with LGU MENRO. A total of 4,000 bamboo propagules and 200 Kupang seedlings were planted on August 13, 2021 along Magat River within Barangays Turod, Dangan, Sallucong, Binarsang, Santiago, Banquero, Santor and Villador, Reina Mercedes;

Cabagan - implemented the project together with LGU Menro, a total of 1,000 bamboo propagules were planted along the Cagayan River and its tributaries, specifically within Balasig Watershed and Barangays Cansan, Balasig, Magassi, Garita, Masipi East, Masipi West, Luquilu, Casibarag Sur, Casibarag Norte, Tallag, Saui, Aggub, San Bernardo and San Juan. Maintenance and protection of the planted propagules in the barangays and watershed shall be conducted by the barangays concerned and LGU MENRO, respectively.

Watershed Rehabilitation Project:

Quezon - site preparation already conducted; area is within LGU Quezon Eco Park; tree planting was rescheduled on September 15, 2021

C. Activities Undertaken in Support of IDDRIP	Patrol works and monitoring activities and maintenance of reforestation areas	ISEP-TF and ENRO personnel conducted regular monitoring and supervision activities of the accomplishment of the winning contractor (Rangayan Natures Spring MPC) in the maintenance and protection of the reforestation areas. Also, ISEP-TF Roving Team conducted wildlings collection and potting activities. For this month, a total of 4,357 wildlings were potted by the team. Other monitoring checkpoints, particularly at Jones and San Pablo, has also started their seedling production with an initial 4,000 and 1,000 target number of seedlings to be produced, respectively. Together with DENR Isabela personnel and the contractor, conducted site inspection for the proposed 800-hectare reforestation area. This is part of the Provincial Government's commitment in the IDRRIP's Reforestation Component in addition to the 250 hectares initial planted areas.

Naguilian Elementary School, City of Ilagan - conducted three (3) tree planting activities during the division-wide tree planting activity on July 27, 2021; 20% survival rate of seedlings planted; currently sourcing out for seedling in replacement of the mortality; shall conduct replanting this on set of rainy season; 3. Sto. Tomas Elementary School, City of Ilagan - conducted three (3) tree planting activities during the division-wide tree planting activity on July 27, 2021; however, a very low survival rate was recorded which according to the school head interviewed, they were not able to conduct maintenance due to lack of personnel; shall conduct another replanting this on set of rainy season;
