The PGI provided 480 forest trees and 1,244 fruit bearing trees with a total of 1,724 seedlings. The activity was participated by the MENRO, PGI-ENRO and the ISEP-Task Force. The LGU concerned will be responsible in the establishment, protection and maintenance activities as counterpart for at least three (3) years when the seedlings can already manage to survive the harsh environment.
