Summary of Waste Disposal:

1. Recyclable Waste

• Total Collected: <u>1308.39 kilograms</u>

Disposal Through: <u>ENRO Materials Recovery Facility (MRF)</u>

2. Residual Waste

• Total Collected: <u>1351.45 kilograms</u>

Disposal Through: <u>City of Ilagan Sanitary Landfill Facility (SLF)</u>

3. Hazardous Waste

• Total Collected: 691.63 kilograms

• Disposal Through: ENRO Materials Recovery Facility (MRF)

4. Biodegradable Waste

• Total Collected: 1229.78 kilograms

• Disposal Through: ENRO Compost Heap and Vermi-composting

Observations:

- Compliance
- Some departments were continuously adhering to waste segregation policies and improves waste management practices.
- Improvement needed in the handling and disposed of hazardous and toxic waste.
- Challenges
- Some offices has no reliever to their employee/utility workers who was involved in bringing wastes to the Provincial RCA/MRF, causing congestion of wastes to their respective offices.
- Limited availability of recycling bins in some offices/departments and establishments.
- Inconsistent waste segregation practices observed in some offices, hospital, and especially in the food court.

Recommendations

- Assign reliever in the absence of focal person/utility workers.
- Increase the number of recycling bins and ensure they are properly labelled.
- Conduct regular IEC sessions on waste segregation and management.
- Implement reliable monitoring system to track waste disposal practices more effectively.

Conclusion:

Therefore, Thirteen (13) Offices/Departments including establishments are found non-conforming, due to Bambanti Festival 2025 weeklong celebration aftermath, since the Province became busy in accommodating huge numbers of visitors coming from different places causing congestions of works resulting the unavailability of focal persons to bring the generated wastes of their respective offices/departments and establishments to the ENRO RCA/MRF. Nevertheless, ENR office continuous its obligation in reiterating the compliance to Executive No. 28 s.2024 and Memorandum No. 13 s.2024 of the Provincial Government of Isabela to concerned offices.
