


This activity aims to assess the effectiveness of local nutrition program implementation, monitor the functionality of Local Nutrition Committees, evaluate accomplishments and gaps, and improve documentation and reporting systems. It also seeks to provide technical recommendations and recognize outstanding performance of Local Nutrition Focal Points such as BNS, LNAOs, and MNPCs to strengthen overall nutrition governance at the local level.<li data-bbox="1011 1697 1503 2387">• PCIDC Cacao Election Reorganization on May 15, 2025 The PPDO, represented by the Assistant Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator (APPDC), attended the meeting. It highlighted the importance of the cacao industry in the province and emphasized the need for continued collaboration and representation. It also aimed to realign goals, strengthen partnerships, and ensure a unified direction and purpose for the council's future initiatives.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Interactive Dashboard: Transforming Data Info Dynamic Insights using MS Power BI on May 19-21, 2025 - Is a 3-day training aimed at capacitating participants in creating visualizations and interactive dashboards using the Microsoft Business Intelligence in enhancing data analysis skills in handling complex data scenarios and improve decision making abilities.• Information Education Communication (IEC) Campaign on Alternative Fuels and other Emerging Technologies on May 22, 2025 -aimed to raise public awareness and promote the adoption of cleaner, sustainable energy sources. The campaign featured discussions on alternative fuels, electric vehicles, and green technologies, engaging stakeholders from both public and private sectors. As a result, participants gained increased knowledge on the benefits and implementation of emerging technologies, and partnerships were initiated to support future advocacy and local adoption efforts.• Training on Mastering Customer Insights: Satisfaction Survey Analysis on May 22-23, 2025 The PPDO represented by Mr. Daryll Jayson P. Zaide, participated in this training to strengthen its capacity in handling and analyzing client feedback. It focused on equipping participants with the tools and techniques for effectively interpreting customer satisfaction survey data and transforming these insights into actionable strategies to enhance service delivery.

P-CART Briefing to EODB Focals, May 26, 2025 - This activity was spearheaded by the Provincial Economic Development Investment Promotions Office as the lead office responsible for ensuring the compliance of the PGI in the EODB. This activity aimed to capacitate EODB focals in the different offices of the PGI with necessary knowledge and information with regards to the compliance with the EODB standards.
