## MONTH AT A GLANCE

For the month of AUGUST, the Public Safety Office, led by department head Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr., together with Jimmy U. Rivera Sr., Assistant department head and concurrent Provincial Security Group Officer-in-Charge participated in various activities for the Province.

The Office joined various coordinating meetings, capability enhancement trainings and worked on confidential matters in line with the initiatives and orders of the Governor. PSO personnel continue to support the various programs and activities of the Office, true to its mandate of providing training and community awareness programs, facilitate coordinating meetings and produce updated Safety IEC materials by constantly researching

new safety measures and acquiring skills and knowledge thru various trainings related to Safety and Health programs.

Also part of our mandate and to show that PSO personnel also practice the emergency evacuation processes we promote, the Office personnel joined evacuation proceedings together with the PGI employees and guests during 3rd Quarter National Simultaneous Earthquake Drill held at the Provincial Capitol grounds.

The Office, tasked to monitor and facilitate implementation of various Road Safety Laws across the Province thru the PNP-PDRRMC Quick Response Motorcycle Riders also known as the EO 18 Riders, continue to monitor operations, provide necessary reports and spread Road Safety Awareness by distributing

Road Safety tips and flyers through various platforms such as the Farmers Congress Reloaded and Social Media.

For the month, the Office joined Farmers Congress activities which were held at the towns of Mallig and Echague.

## LTFRB, DOTr, DILG : CAPABILITY BUILDING AND LOCAL PUBLIC TRANSPORT ROUTE PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT COURSE

As part of the group composed of personnel from the Office of the Provincial Engineer, Provincial Planning and Development Office and Public Safety Office sent to attend the LPTRP training course, PSO personnel Manuel Cesar G. Binag IV and Francis David G. Gangan proceeded to attend said training last August 13-17, 2018 held at Japi Hotel and Convention center, Cauayan City, Isabela. Counterpart City and Municipal LGU personnel across the Province also attended said event initiated by the LTFRB, DILG and DOST.

Various workshops



and lectures with regards to local transport modernization, QGIS and JICA-STRADA planning software and data gathering methods were introduced by lecturers Sir Joel Bolano, then LTFRB Region II Director Nash Talipasan and LTFRB Engineer Joel Salvador. Days 1 and 2 was mostly classroom training regarding the various programs and initiatives from the LTFRB and importance of consolidating Local Transportation data from the LGU

themselves for route planning and franchising. The 3rd to last day of training involved data gathering, systems familiarization and practical application of the topics discussed as the participants were grouped into 3 and were given separate tasks and sent to different areas for conducting the surveys. As part of the activities to complete the seminar, participants were tasked to survey local transport routes by recording vehicle registration numbers for a specific route, examining Origin-Destination and encoding the same on the QGIS application in preparation for JICA-Strada upload (LTFRB system/Application used for Transport Routing.)




