**II. Highlights of Accomplishment**

- There are 4 admission from January and February 2018
- There were 2 among 22 residents integrated to their family last January and February 2018.
- Assisted 4 sick residents for confinement at GFNDY Hospital and 3 months physical therapy session of 1 residents ( Jane Doe)
- Assisted 7 residents in court hearing at Cauayan City, Isabela, Cabagan Isabela and Hall of Justice, City of Ilagan, Isabela.
- 6 House Parent, 1 nurse and 1 Psychologist attended 1 batch of training entitled “Professionalizing the House Parenting Job in Residential, Rehabilitation & Therapeutic Centers” and 3 Social Workers attended PASWI Convention.
- Conducted 3 regular monthly staff meeting.
- Conducted 4 Home Visits to family of residents.

- Conducted 4 case conferences with rehabilitation team.
- Series of consultation meeting with PSWDO and DSWD field office.
- Conducted character building meeting with children every month.
- Formulated 7 Intervention Plan of residents.
- Updated 5 case study reports.
- Assisted 3 schooled High School for their academic award (with honor) and 5 elementary students for their recognition and moving up ceremony.
- Drafted additional policy regulating the operation of WCPC.

### **III. Problem encountered**

- Newly admitted residents not yet undergone Psychological Assessment due to inadequate budget and no counterpart of referral party (cost of Psychological Assessment per child package is 10,000.00).
- Transportation for schooled residents became a problem of the center (P5 allotted for tricycle fare is no longer accepted by the tricycle driver).
- Released budget for repair of kitchen last February 2018 yet until now no repair activity.
