

Day Care Service Program	<p>Orientation on day care service among parents of children enrolled in the Provincial Capitol Early Learning Center for SY 2021-2022</p> <p>Enhancement of Modules to be provided to children in the early learning center</p> <p>LCAT – VAWC Functionality</p>	<p>Orientation on day care service program was conducted to parents of children dividing them to three (3) groups to comply with the Covid-19 health protocols. The orientation aims not only to provide information on programs and services for early learning but also to guide the parents on how to handle and manage their own children while having class session at home. A brief lecture on their roles and responsibilities both inside and out the Center as stated in the early learning standards were also discussed.</p> <p>The 15 modules as being reviewed in comparison to the Learning Resource Packages (LRP) provided by the ECCD Council for Services Providers were distributed to parents also for their review, enhancement and recommendation (if necessary) to be able to meet the developmental appropriateness in the learning of children. The modules, after which, shall be provided to the children for free and to be utilized in their home session having their parents or guardians as their temporary teacher while face to face is prohibited. On the other hand, parents or guardians are advised to report every two weeks with the modules and a notebook where they wrote down their observations with their kids while having their session at home for the directions of the service provider.</p> <p>Administered the Mapping Tool on VAW programs, services, and facilities from DILG Provincial Office.</p>
